K-3 Elementary Summer Reading Academy 2015

***If your child was selected for this program you will receive an informational packet with registration information soon.**

The Ohio Dept. of Education requires school districts to provide intensive remediation for students who are not on track for reading. ESRA will provide your child an opportunity to participate in a six week summer program to address their reading difficulties and ensure they are in the best position to excel in school the next academic year. The Academy will enhance your child's positive feelings toward learning, help him or her build greater confidence in their abilities and keep your child's skills sharp over the summer.

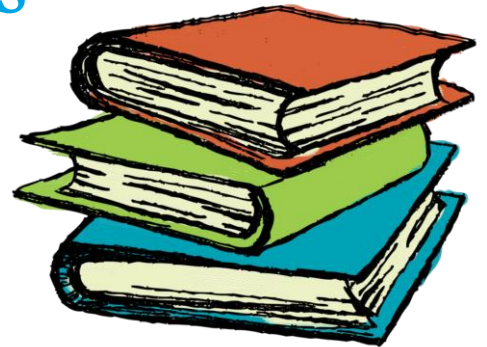

Junior Medical Camp

Camp I (Grades 3-5): The Human Animal

Learn how humans have survived hundreds of thousands of years in extreme environments.

SEMAA is open to students enrolled in grades K-12 and is not limited by academic progress, school district or county. Further enrollment is offered at no cost.

The program is conducted in three 7 week Saturday sessions during the academic year (fall, winter and spring) and in a weeklong ½ day summer camps as funding allows. K-12 students can participate once during the academic year and again during the summer!
